Subject Overview: Religious Education (KS4)

Pupils in Years 10 and 11 receive a minimum of two Religious Studies lessons per week, each lasting an hour. The scheme of work follows the AQA GCSE Religious Studies A curriculum (Code: 8062A).

All pupils study the following elements of this curriculum:

- Component 1 (C1): Beliefs, Teachings and Practices of Christianity and Islam
- Component 2 (C2) Theme B: Religion and Life
- Component 2 (C2) Theme D: Religion, Peace and Conflict
- Component 2 (C2) Theme E: Religion, Crime and Punishment
- Component 2 (C2) Theme F: Religion, Human Rights and Social Justice

Regular assessments will measure pupils' progress in knowledge retention and skill development. A variety of evaluative strategies are used throughout the course, including verbal feedback, class quizzes, teacher observation and formal GCSE practice questions.
