#### <u>YEAR 8</u>

In Year 8 we focus on the period between 1500 – 1900:

- What sort of King was Henry VIII?

- Did Mary I deserve her notorious reputation?

- What kind of Queen was Elizabeth I?

- The Gunpowder Plot: Why did Guy Fawkes plot to blow up the Houses of Parliament?

- What caused the Civil War and what role did Oliver Cromwell play?
- Why did people believe in witches?
- Why did Britain seek to establish an empire?
- How did slavery originate and why was it abolished?
- What was life like for child workers in industrial Britain?

### <u>YEAR 9</u>

In Year 9 we arrive at the 20<sup>th</sup> Century:

- Why was Jack the Ripper never caught?
- What caused the First World War, and what was it like to live and fight through it?
- How did Hitler come to power and how did Germany change as a result?
- What was the Holocaust?
- What caused the Second War, and what was it like to live and fight through it?
- What was the Cold War and what was its significance?
